Simon, a Grade 6 student, in his second year of the Brock-Georgina Garden 4-H club was the grower with the heaviest pumpkin this year. He said part of his success is with using lots of fertilizer and "I hug and pat all my giant pumpkins," he says demonstrating by giving Stefan a big hug. He says he thinks naming his pumpkins help them "grow bigger" too.

He says this "year was even crazier" for all that came to his garden. There were cucumber beetles followed an infestation of stink bugs then the massive rain storms, the young gardener said. He added there were also spells of really dry weather to the point, "we had to have three water deliveries." Simon reports this had to happen to keep the water levels topped up for watering the thirsty giants in Simon's garden because the well couldn't meet the need of the giants.

The work paid off though for Simon and he began a little business as he's had some sales for his named orange giants. They sold for .50 cents a pound and sales have included Stefan to Newmarket, Mattie to Peterborough and Halifax to Lindsay. Simon gives back 10% of all his pumpkin sales to the local food banks to help his community.

Simon was part of a large group of enthusiastic youth gardeners of the Brock-Georgiana 4-H Garden Club. The club held an achievement day at Pefferlaw Peat in Pefferlaw recently.

Brooks Farms is a popular destination for tourists and school groups alike during the summer and fall. Many summer camps load up their little charges onto school buses and spend the day discovering farm life and playing on and with the activities.

How did this farm-based entertainment complex get its start?

Edward Brooks immigrated to Canada back in the mid 1800s when he moved his family from England to Uxbridge. A few years later they bought the farm in Mount Albert and started up a cash cropping opera-

The website explains, "For over 150 years the farm grew corn, wheat, barley, turnips, potatoes, and all sorts of farm animals. In 1990, the fourth generation farmer, Alvin Brooks and his wife Brenda, decided that growing pick your own strawberries and raspberries would help put their sons and daughter through school. In 1994, their second oldest son, Paul, decided to farm full-time with his father.

In 1998, after several years of growth with strawberries and raspberries, Brooks Farms started to offer pick your own pumpkins, and the Fall Fun Festival was born. In 2007, Kelly joined the Brooks family. Her graphic design skills were put to use rebranding the farm and giving it the quirky character's customers have come to know and love: The Barnyard

Paul and Kelly were married in 2010. The festival continues to grow each year adding more attractions."

Brenda Brooks confides the farm is always busy and lots of fun! She says they hope to expand even more fresh produce and homemade baked goods, as well as even a restaurant.
